Best practice spiritually-integrated psychotherapy and care is more than utilizing the correct words at the right time based upon informed theoretical constructs. Research corroborates that the most important ingredient in the clinical practice is the therapeutic relationship. Central in the therapeutic relationship is the nature of the alliance between the therapist and the client or client system.

Most clinical training gives particular attention to the unconscious aspects of this alliance often called the “transference dynamics” in which the client or the client system “transfers” unconscious material onto the therapist and the therapist’s unconscious process with the client/client system is referred to as either “countertransference” or “the therapist’s transference.”

Often obscure or overlooked during clinical training and supervision is the “music” of the therapeutic alliance. This music is what is occurring energetically in each person and between them in the clinical moment and is the real life drive. Typically these energetic interchanges are preverbal and empower and contextualize the deeper meaning of all words uttered and non-verbal cues.

Learning to recognize, read, work with, utilize, and empower relationships energetically is perhaps one of the most important gifts and art forms of the skilled psychotherapist and caregiver. This gift seems to be present deep within the real healer from the outset of one’s calling to serve. Unfortunately often this gift goes unidentified and/or has gotten “trained out of” the emerging professional because science only in recent years has been able to acknowledge its existence due to newly discovered and approved research methodology.

This workshop offers encouragement to persons engaged in claiming and utilizing this valuable energetic gift. Participants in this workshop will learn to:

1. **Appreciate the latest research regarding energy medicine.**
2. **Sense one’s own energy at work.**
3. **Articulate the basic principles of Healing Touch as one way of operationalizing energy medicine.**
4. **Integrate energetic thinking into one’s theory of change.**
5. **Apply energetic principles, perspective, and interventions to spiritually-integrated psychotherapy and care cases.**

This workshop is designed by the Chapter at Charlotte of the AAPCSE to provide 6 contact hours under the NBCC Approved Content Area: Counseling Theory as well as the regulations of the Emerge Family Therapy Center & Teaching Clinic for the SC LLR. **Honoring NBCC standards, presentations start on time and attendance for the full workshop is required.
